## **Messages from the Principal**

Good morning families

We have had a terrific, albeit wet, start to the term. Last week you would have received your child's attendance report for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of Term 1. Please take the time to read the information

on the back of this report, as it has many handy tips for supporting your child with their attendance. If your child is absent, please let us know on the day or by the following day, as all unexplained absences are recorded as such and monitored closely at school and network level. Our aim is to reduce unexplained absences and improve our attendance rates overall. Our school target is for students to have an attendance rate of 95% or above. Over a five-week period, this equates to 1 day absent. For your interest, in our last reporting period the attendance rates were:

100% attendance - 10% of students

96% attendance – 33% of students

93% attendance - 8% of students



89% attendance – 12% of students

<85% attendance – 24% of students

Whilst there is much to celebrate here, you can see that almost one quarter of our students are in the 'Cause for concern' and 'Critical cause for concern' categories. We thank you for supporting our high expectations for student attendance and we are here to help should you require further assistance.

This term we are strongly encouraging all students to improve their home reading. This has a direct correlation on reading achievement at school, which then impacts on learning in every single subject. In my role as Teaching Principal, I have been running learning support interventions in reading for several years now. It is incredible to see how students who have a regular home reading practice – and high rates of attendance, improve far more rapidly in reading skills than those who don't. Learning to read is a complex and sometimes challenging process. The only way to get better is by doing it, practising it regularly and making time for it. Our teachers are working strategically (myself included) to ensure we are doing our very best to ensure our teaching of reading is based on evidence based practices. Home reading doesn't have to be a chore – just 10 minutes every day will reap rewards.

Reading with your child at home will assist their development. Some strategies include:

- set aside some uninterrupted time to read aloud with your child
- read to your child in your first language -research shows that using your first language will help your child when he or she learns to read English
- listen to your child read every day, even if only for a short time
- talk about books together-make reading a shared, enjoyable activity
- discuss the meanings of stories and words
- ensure there is a range of reading material for your child at home, both fiction and nonfiction
- give books as treats and presents
- join your local library borrow books for yourself as well as your child

This term we are also running a competition between the classes on books borrowed from the library. Students have voted on the prize for the winning class, and we look forward to seeing our borrowing rates improve. To borrow, students need to ensure they have a library bag (any bag will do, even a shopping bag), and they have no outstanding loans.

Yesterday a select group of senior students attend the 'Great Debate" at Glenreagh Public School with students from the Orara Valley. From all reports they had an enjoyable, yet challenging day, putting their debating skills to the test. Congratulations to all students involved: Alexis, Carter, Tristan, Jathan, Lachlan, KB and Madison.

#### **Dental Van Visit**


